Labyrinths are pathways for prayer...

Labyrinths have a single pathway that turns back on itself at least once before reaching a center.





What do you need to know about labyrinths before you pray them?




"Listen, my child, and be wise, and direct your mind in the way." Proverbs 23:19


A labyrinth is different than a maze. You can't get lost in a labyrinth.



"O that my people would listen to me, that Israel would walk in my ways!" Psalm 81:13



As long as you stay on the path, you will arrive in the center.

"Do not be afraid, for I am your God, I will strengthen you, I will help you." Isaiah 41:10


On the labyrinth, one follows the way (path) to the center.

One thus practices walking towards God, Our Center.



"I am the way, the truth, and the life." Jesus John 14:6


There is a cross in the center of most labyrinths.



"May I never boast of anything but the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world." Galatians 6:14 You enter the labyrinth, take the pathway to the center, rest there, and then return on the "same" pathway, crossing the threshold once more.



Matthew 11:28 "Come to me, all you who are weary and heavy laden, and I will give you rest."



Labyrinths are sometimes walked alone, but they can also be places of shared prayer.

"You shall put these words of mine in your heart and soul...
Teach them to your children, talking about them when you are at home and when you are away..."

Deuteronomy 11:18

Children love to run the labyrinth. Find the pace that is right you.



"David danced before God with all his might." 2 Samuel 6:14

It is okay to walk around people, or to stop and let them walk around you.



"Love your neighbor as yourself." Luke 10:27

Use common courtesy when sharing the path. It is like a 2-way street.



"Peace be to the whole community, and love with faith, from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." Ephesians 6:23

Sometimes people walk the labyrinth together, sometimes alone, and sometimes one person walks while others pray for that person.



"Pray for one another..." James 5:16b

Labyrinth prayers can be walked or danced.

The labyrinth is often like a mirror in which God helps one to see her/his life more fully.

Notice what is happening around and within you as you are using a labyrinth. Make everything a part of your prayer.

Pray with your whole body as you move.




Psalm 63:4 "I will lift up my hands and call on your name."

Before entering a labyrinth you may ask, "What do I want to pray about?"

One suggestion for praying the labyrinth:

On the way to the center, pray for yourself.

In the center, rest with God.

On the way back to the threshold, pray for others.

Or, you may prefer to repeat a simple prayer phrase such as:

"May Your will be done." Matthew 6:10 After completing prayer with a labyrinth, it is helpful to take time to reflect on the meanings of the experience.

There is no "right" or "wrong" way to pray on a labyrinth. Pray in any way that you like!


Labyrinths are sometimes used as a tool to explore the possibilities of reconciliation.

Many labyrinths are found in hospitals and other healing environments. They are used by staff, patients, and their families.



Some labyrinths are created for special times of prayer. Others are permanent.





Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." John 14:27


